## New ITGA web service for timber sales – [www.itga.ie](http://www.itga.ie)

Members of ITGA can now post any timber lots for sale on the ITGA website free of charge.

As more and more private forests reach the thinning stage, access to timber markets becomes vital. The ITGA is playing its role in the development of a timber marketing infrastructure. The association has expanded its information service to members to include an online Timber Advertising Service.

This new web service allows ITGA members and their forest managers to widely publicise the sale of forest timber, significantly increasing their marketing-power. The service builds on the availability of current statistics on timber prices for ITGA members which are also accessed on the ITGA website [www.itga.ie](http://www.itga.ie). Together these services constitute formidable marketing tools that allow the association's members get ahead of the game.

Using this new online service is easy. ITGA Members and their foresters selling timber can advertise parcels of standing or felled timber by simply completing the online Timber Sales Information Form to submit their timber sale details. The timber sales information submitted will then be displayed in our online Sales Catalogue for buyers to view. Timber buyers can review information about the latest available private sector timber sales in the online Sales Catalogue. The Sales Catalogue is updated on a regular basis.

This ITGA service is exclusively available for use by ITGA Members and their foresters. As always vendors should ensure that they have taken professional advice on their timber sale and the harvesting of their forest and that a harvest plan/management plan has been drawn up for their forest property. This exciting new service demonstrates the ITGA's commitment to the development of private forestry in Ireland to its full potential.
